**2020 Parking**

GREENFIELD – Parking permit renewals and purchasing will begin **Tuesday, December 17<sup>th</sup>**, this includes individuals who currently hold permits and those seeking to purchase a new permit. Starting this year, permits will be purchased in a first come, first serve basis. Parking lot permits are sold **annually only**; however, you can purchase monthly passes at the Olive Street Parking Garage. To purchase a 2020 parking permit, one can purchase online or in-person at the Treasurer/Collectors Office, “Service Center”. To expedite the process, we recommend purchasing online on the City’s website. Please take note that moving forward; the Treasurer/Collectors Office will be handling all parking related inquiries. Permits should be picked up in the Treasurer/Collectors Office, we are unable to mail.

The City of Greenfield is pleased to announce the launch of Passport Parking, a mobile app that facilitates payments for parking. For the first time, residents and visitors in Greenfield will have the option to pay for parking with their smartphones. Signage and decals are displayed to guide drivers to where the Passport Parking app can be used.

In addition to being able to pay for parking through the app, drivers are able to:

- Extend their sessions remotely
- Keep track of all parking history
- Receive notifications
- Get email receipts

“Greenfield is a place where there’s plenty to explore right outside our front doors, including great dining, shopping, architecture and history. The Passport Parking app gives our residents and visitors a convenient option to drive into town and pay for parking from their smartphones.” said Mayor William Martin. Drivers can easily download the Passport Parking app from the App Store or Google Play, create an account with an email address or phone number. Then proceed to enter their license plate and length of stay. If users want to park longer, they can extend time remotely right from their phones. Parking can also be managed online at [passportparking.com](http://passportparking.com).

“We’re excited to partner with the City of Greenfield and introduce another way to pay for parking. One of the best features of the app is that it notifies users when their parking time will expire. Drivers can then extend their parking time directly from their smartphones up to the maximum allotted time” said Mollie Bolin, sales executive at Passport
